THIS WEEK WE'RE LEARNING:

When you love like Jesus, you will be a light.

MATTHEW 5:14-16

MEMORY VERSE:

"Love each other as I have loved you." JOHN 15:12, NIV

MOTIONS:

Love each other - hug yourself

As I - point up

Have loved you - point thumbs to

chest

PRAYER:

Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to teach us how to love each other. Sometimes it's hard, but we know Jesus is with us and will help us love like He loves. Help us love others. We want to be a shining light of love everywhere we go. We love You, God. In Jesus' name, amen

FAMILY ACTIVITIES: SHINE YOUR LIGHT

WHAT YOU DO: Read the attached game cards one at a time. If what you read is a way we can love like Jesus, have your child make their light shine (either a flashlight or just opening and closing their hands like turning a light on or off). If what you read is not how we love like Jesus, then make sure their light is off. When we love others the way Jesus loves us, we shine our light. That light tells the world that Jesus loves them

GET IN AND DRIVE

WHAT YOU DO: Using materials from around the house, like boxes and flashlights and paper plates, have your child make a car. Tell them that this month, we are talking about how they can "Start your engines, and GO be a light in the world like Jesus!"

You have two toy cars so you share one of your cars with your little brother so he can play.

Your friend does not have a snack so you give him one of your cookies.

You get very angry with your big sister so you yell at her and say mean words.

You see your dad picking up toys in the living room and you help him.

Your neighbor is sick so you pick some flowers and give them to her.

Your coat is too small, but there's nothing wrong with it, so you give it to another child who needs a coat to stay warm.

You go to the store to buy extra school supplies to give to other children who don't have school supplies. You get mad at your mom because she won't let you have candy so you scream at her and tell her you don't like her.

A new family moves into a house on your street so you and your mom make cookies to take to them. One of the children in your class breaks one of your crayons. You forgive them instead of getting mad.

One of your friends is having a birthday party so you pick out a present you know they will really like and you give it to them.

Your friend is sad so you draw them a picture and try and make them feel better.

You scream angry words at your mom but later you tell her you're sorry and ask her to forgive you.

You have four cookies and your sister has no cookies. You hide all of your cookies so you won't have to share them with your sister.

You have A LOT of toys that you never play with so you go through them and pick some to give to children who don't have any toys.

You sell lemonade and cookies and then give all the money you make to help families have food to eat.
